Spelling Spelling test words will go home on Mondays. On the calendar you will find the spelling words and test dates. On the test day, the students will also work to print a sentence (or two) on their own. As they print at home, encourage them to begin printing at the top of the letter, leave finger spaces between words, begin with an uppercase letter, and end with a period. While they should print the spelling words correctly, they should stretch the sounds of other words to represent as many as possible. Perfection is not the goal. Invented spelling helps them grow!

<u>Club Reading</u> Thank you for reading daily and signing the sheets! Many students have finished Club 25 and have moved on to Club 50. Congratulations! Whenever the sheet is filled, please send it in!

Folders/Water Bottles/Snack Please be sure to send a healthy snack (in a separate container, if possible). With colder weather comes extra clothes which takes more time to deal with after recess. Having a snack that is quick to grab helps us to get to math more quickly!! Water bottles, Buddy Books, and Take Home Folders should be sent in every day. Thank you!:)
